

## Community Needs Assessment Survey City of Missoula City& Missoula County

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#### Overview & Methodology

Fall 2018, the City of Missoula and Missoula County partnered to conduct a Community Needs Assessment Survey. The City of Missoula and Missoula County created an online survey using Survey Monkey. The online survey was distributed October 1-22, 2018 using multiple approaches - email listservs, postcards, links on Missoulaevents.net, and Americorps VistaVolunteers, to name a few. The purpose of the survey was to examine perceptions regarding satisfaction with municipal and county services more broadly.

The City of Missoula and Missoula County requested that a research team from the University of Montana's Social Science Research Laboratory (SSRL) aggregate and report findings. Dr. Sara Rinfret worked with a graduate student who is well versed in data analysis to organize and report aggregate level findings.

Although survey methodology is scientifically rigorous, there are limitations. For instance, the sample size is unknown for this research due to the variety of distribution lists used to invite respondents to participate. The survey was conducted online, which could limit the participation of individuals that do not have access to Internet. We suggest that these limitations should be considered when examining the aggregate data in this report.

The following report provides an overview of the demographic data of the 393 respondents that opted to take the online survey. Aggregate level data of responses per survey question are presented in this report. We used the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) to examine the data. The research team used NVivo, a qualitative software to visualize responses for respondents that selected "other" for their response to a variety of survey questions.

# Section I: Overview of Demographic Data

The majority of respondents were within the ages of 27-64. Participants varied in their total household income with approximately 18 percent earning 50,000-74,999 dollars per year. Moreover, 30.8 percent make less than 49,999 dollars per year. More than half the sample indicated that they are "employed for wages."








